

2015 Performance Report Montezuma County, Colorado

The Region 9 Economic Development District of Southwest Colorado Inc. (Region 9), is a nonprofit, 501 (c) 6 public private partnership with a mission that promotes and coordinates economic and community development efforts throughout southwest Colorado. Region 9 covers five counties, ten municipalities and the two Native American Tribes in Colorado (Ute Mountain Ute and Southern Ute).

Incorporated in 1989, Region 9 is led by a 26-member board of directors; 17 from local governmental jurisdictions and 9 from the private sector.

In addition to these programs Region 9 also provides social and economic data, technical assistance and research for local and regional projects.

Technical Assistance – Region 9 provides technical assistance in Montezuma County and area municipalities by participating in community meetings, writing and administering grants, and advocating for communities at regional, state and federal levels. Below are some specific examples at the county level, see specifics for individual communities on the following pages.

County-wide (Individual communities are below)

- Provides support for regional Four Corners Film Office increasing film and television productions in Montezuma County. Inquiries in 2015 included production for SW Health Systems, Discovery Channel True Crime Series and Motley Fool interviews as well as numerous referrals of production professionals.
- Working closely with Montezuma Community Economic Development Association (MCEDA) and economic development specialist, Chris Burkett and now Chelsea Jones.
- Worked with County and Federal delegation on recreation and management plan for McPhee Reservoir.
- Applied for Community Development Finance Institution (CDFI) designation but application on hold.
- Involved the State Office of Economic Development regarding incentives for county based businesses including Osprey.
- County had 21 business inquiries not tied to specific community (please see below for community specific inquires) go through Region 9.
- Updated the Montezuma Community Development Action Plan.

Regional Initiatives – Region 9 works across the region which includes several efforts that have the potential to positively impact your county. Below is a list of some of those initiatives.

- Committed match for SW Colorado Council of Governments DoLA grant for broadband.
- Participating in POWER Career Fair offered for regional high school students.

The Southwest Colorado Accelerator Program for Entrepreneurs (SCAPE) offers in-depth mentoring, office space and an equity investment to help new ventures enter markets and raise capital. Since beginning in 2013, the program has graduated 10 companies, created 26 jobs and raised almost \$3 Million in capital to grow their businesses. The majority of the funds raised are spent locally, with web design, marketing, technology or production needs, accounting and small business services. SCAPE graduated Easton LaChappelle from Mancos, who at age 20 is

designing prosthetics and is being highlighted by Cadillac (http://www.daregreatly.com/explore/experience-cadillac/dont-you-dare/easton-lachapelle).

Enterprise Zones – All of Montezuma County is a designated Enterprise Zone and will remain so for the next ten years. The State reviews the boundaries every 10 years to make sure they meet EZ criteria. Montezuma fit the criteria. This program provides financial incentives to businesses to promote and encourage new job creation. A business (which includes a farm or mine) located within these boundaries may be eligible for EZ tax credits, including capital investment tax credits, job tax credits, research and development tax credits, and other incentives. Montezuma saw 116 businesses participating in the program that showed a gain of 15 total jobs, with the amount of tax credits of \$52,313,283.

From 1993 through 2015, Montezuma County businesses claimed approximately **\$505 million** in eligible investments, resulting in **\$11,906,683** in certified tax credits, and reported **1,657** jobs though the program.

The Enterprise Zone project designation allows all donor contributions of at least \$100 or more (depending on the organization) to be eligible for a 25% state tax credit on cash donations, and a 12.5% state tax credit on in-kind donations. In 2015, EZ projects have brought in cash and in-kind contributions valued at \$3.91 million.


